Dear friends,

Prayer – a great gift that we can give to one another. It is a wonderful way to communicate with God. Prayer is simply – talking to God. Prayer and faith have to go hand in hand. If we pray without faith then it is a waste of time. We should strongly believe that God listens to our prayers and He will answer it.

There are various ways that we can pray. The Parish community encourages us to pray as a parish. I also request you to pray in your family. Individual prayers strengthen oneself with the God Almighty. The Gospel of today reminds us, that we can pray for one another. The Centurion pleads with Jesus to cure his daughter. Jesus didn't let him down and his faithful prayer was answered. Jesus brings her back to life.

The woman with the illness speaks of her tremendous faith in God. She thought to herself, even just touching the fringe of His cloak will cure her. And she was cured! So, both praying for others and praying for oneself is important.

Some ideas to pray better:

- Remember in prayer, we are talking to God the Almighty.
 Be respectful. Be sweet. Be short don't bore Him with what He knows already with babbling of words. (Remember the advice of Jesus)
- Choose a right time to pray, in other words, give the best time for God. (If you are tired, sleep). Pray when you are at your best.
- Learn to make your own prayers. Though the printed books might help, God wants to hear what you have got to say to
 Him
- Remember the Holy Eucharist (Mass) is the Supreme form of prayer. Don't give excuse to skip it. It is not enough to pray the Holy Rosary by skipping the Mass.
- Spend at least few minutes composing yourself before prayer. One cannot concentrate straight away.
- Don't pray the Holy Rosary while driving unless you want to see God right away!
- If you want love, unity, peace in your family, have family prayer everyday.
- Keep the gadgets away when you pray.

As I promise my prayers for you, I request you to pray for me. Thank you.

THE MASS

What is the Structure of the Mass and why do we do what we do, in the Mass?

Archbishop Mark Coleridge takes us through the Catholic Mass in this multi part series.

The Mass Series: Part 9 & 10 – Liturgy of the Eucharist – Preface & Eucharistic Prayer (Part 1)

And, we're saying to God, breathe in to these gifts to make them more than bread and wine. And the roots of that invocation of the Spirit are very, very deep. They take us way back to the beginning of the biblical story where God, we're told, picks up a lump of earth – good, rich soil – and then breathes His breath, His

Spirit, into the soil. And, what do you get? The human being. The creation of the human being.

And, similarly, in the moment of Pentecost, we're told Jesus breathes on the disciples. It's the same breath. The same Spirit. So, just as soil becomes a human being and these disciples, locked in their upper room because of fear, they become a Church that explodes out on to the streets of the world in mission. So, they are transformed by that breath.

And we're saying to God, do what you have done before. Breathe upon these gifts of bread and wine to make them much more than bread and wine. Transform these gifts by the power of your Spirit as you've done before into the body and blood of Jesus Christ crucified and risen. Make Him here and now. Not once upon a time.

And we make that prayer in faith that God will do, here and now, what God has done before. And then we tell the story of the Last Supper. Now it can be tempting to think of the Mass as a kind of role play of the Last Supper but it's much more than that. It's not just remembering something that happened once upon a time. It's remembering with such power, in fact in the power of the Holy Spirit, that what we remember becomes present.

So that the words of Jesus are spoken by the priest. Again, the priest doesn't have words of his own to speak. He says: 'Take this all of you and eat of it, for this is My Body'. He doesn't say: 'for this is the body of Jesus'. This is My Body. So, it's the word of Jesus being spoken through the priest over the bread and over the wine. This is My Body. This is My Blood.

And, what we believe, is that the word of Jesus here and now, not once upon a time, the word of Jesus has power enough to take bread and wine and transform them into the Body and Blood of Jesus crucified and risen.
