## THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Year C
In the Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about two people who went to the Temple to pray. The Pharisee tells God how good he is, while the tax collector talked to God about what is going on in his life and asks for forgiveness. The tax collector went home at rights with God, the other did not. The tax collector was humble enough to admit his mistakes and ask for forgiveness and therefore his prayer was heard, while the Pharisee's prayer, Jesus tells us that he said it to himself. In his pride, the Pharisee also uses the tax collector as a comparison, to make himself look better. The first reading tells us "The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds"...

God wants us to be good but not to be proud. Every good thing that we are and have comes from God. Humility is not to be considered as a weakness but as a strength. It takes humility to look inside one's self, to identify areas where God's help and forgiveness are needed and to ask for these. This journey must be taken in order to move forward in our spiritual lives. An Examination of Conscience guide might help. If our hearts are open and humble before God, spiritual growth is possible and our relationship with God will develop. We must learn to be humble before God because He is much more concerned with the openness of our hearts than a mask that we try and put on. He knows us inside out and we can never hide our true selves from Him. He is Our Father, ready to welcome us with open arms. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is probably not used as much as it should be in today's world and yet through this Sacrament one's sins are forgiven, forgotten and given the grace to do better.

## VI. The Paschal Banquet

## The fruits of Holy Communion

1396 The unity of the Mystical Body: the Eucharist makes the Church. Those who receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. Through it Christ unites them to all the faithful in one body - the Church. Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism. In Baptism we have been called to form but one body. 230 The Eucharist fulfills this call: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? the bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread:" 231

If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are you respond "Amen" ("yes, it is true!") and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words, "the Body of Christ" and respond "Amen." Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your Amen may be true. ${ }^{232}$

1397 The Eucharist commits us to the poor. To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren:

You have tasted the Blood of the Lord, yet you do not recognize your brother,.... You dishonor this table when you do not judge worthy of sharing your food someone judged worthy to take part in this meal.... God freed you from all your sins and invited you here, but you have not become more merciful. ${ }^{233}$

1398 The Eucharist and the unity of Christians. Before the greatness of this mystery St. Augustine exclaims, "O sacrament of devotion! O sign of unity! O bond of charity!" 234 The more painful the experience of the divisions in the Church which break the common participation in the table of the Lord, the more urgent are our prayers to the Lord that the time of complete unity among all who believe in him may return.

1399 The Eastern churches that are not in full communion with the Catholic Church celebrate the Eucharist with great love. "These Churches, although separated from us, yet possess true sacraments, above all - by apostolic succession the priesthood and the Eucharist, whereby they are still joined to us in closest intimacy." A certain communion in sacris, and so in the Eucharist, "given suitable circumstances and the approval of Church authority, is not merely possible but is encouraged. ${ }^{2355}$
