The story of Zacchaeus is a favourite Bible story for many. Though short in stature, Zacchaeus didn't let this hinder him; he was anxious to see Jesus, so he climbed a tree to get a glimpse of Jesus when he passed. Being a senior tax collector, Zacchaeus was considered a sinner by the crowd, as many tax collectors used to cheat their own countrymen by charging more tax and pocketing the difference. They collected taxes for the Romans, who were the occupying power at that time. Therefore, being a tax collector automatically labelled Zacchaeus a sinner and an outcast in society. Jesus disregarded all the 'labels' and saw the state that Zacchaeus' soul was in and immediately went to save him.

Jesus stopped under his tree, he called Zacchaeus by name and invited Himself to his house-Jesus outdid Zacchaeus' expectations. The urgency in Jesus' words 'Come down, hurry', shows the urgency of how one must co-operate with Jesus' graces, given daily, to attain eternal life in Heaven. We can say that it was curiosity that made him climb a tree to get a glimpse of Jesus as he wanted to know who Jesus was, but surely, it was also the grace of God calling him to come close to the throne of Mercy. This Divine Plan took Jesus not only to Zacchaeus' house but also to Zacchaeus' heart. When Zacchaeus met Jesus, there was a conversion, a transformation. The crowd grumbled that Jesus was going to a sinner's house, but Zacchaeus stood his ground and showed them that Jesus brought a change in his life for the better. Zacchaeus put himself in a situation where he could meet Jesus. Are we making use of the graces that God gives us every day by going to Mass, reading the Bible or attending prayer meeting? Do we also need Jesus to deliver us from something that is not allowing us to get closer to Him? Let us talk to Jesus about it.

VI. The Paschal Banquet

The fruits of Holy Communion

1400 Ecclesial communities derived from the Reformation and separated from the Catholic Church, "have not preserved the proper reality of the Eucharistic mystery in its fullness, especially because of the absence of the sacrament of Holy Orders."²³⁶ It is for this reason that Eucharistic intercommunion with these communities is not possible for the Catholic Church. However these ecclesial communities, "when they commemorate the Lord's death and resurrection in the Holy Supper . . . profess that it signifies life in communion with Christ and await his coming in glory."²³⁷

1401 When, in the Ordinary's judgment, a grave necessity arises, Catholic ministers may give the sacraments of Eucharist, Penance, and Anointing of the Sick to other Christians not in full communion with the Catholic Church, who ask for them of their own will, provided they give evidence of holding the Catholic faith regarding these sacraments and possess the required dispositions.²³⁸

VII. The Eucharist - "Pledge of the Glory To Come"

1402 In an ancient prayer the Church acclaims the mystery of the Eucharist: "O sacred banquet in which Christ is received as food, the memory of his Passion is renewed, the soul is filled with grace and a pledge of the life to come is given to us." If the Eucharist is the memorial of the Passover of the Lord Jesus, if by our communion at the altar we are filled "with every heavenly blessing and grace,"²³⁹ then the Eucharist is also an anticipation of the heavenly glory.

1403 At the Last Supper the Lord himself directed his disciples' attention toward the fulfillment of the Passover in the kingdom of God: "I tell you I shall not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."²⁴⁰ Whenever the Church celebrates the Eucharist she remembers this promise and turns her gaze "to him who is to come." In her prayer she calls for his coming: "Marana tha!" "Come, Lord Jesus!"²⁴¹ "May your grace come and this world pass away!"²⁴²

1404 The Church knows that the Lord comes even now in his Eucharist and that he is there in our midst. However, his presence is veiled. Therefore we celebrate the Eucharist "awaiting the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ,"²⁴³ asking "to share in your glory when every tear will be wiped away. On that day we shall see you, our God, as you are. We shall become like you and praise you for ever through Christ our Lord."²⁴⁴
