The chief disciple and us

Peter, the impetuous disciple ever on the front foot, affirmed his readiness to die with the Lord. He went ballistic when Christ prophesied about his triple denial before the cock crows. He swore never to let down the master who had given them much hope for the redemption of Israel. At the appointed time, Peter was covered in tears because he could not stand a mere servant-girl in the High Priest's courtyard. A new Peter emerged from this mud, bathed in sorrow and with great confidence in God's mercy.

The Gospel brings to us one of those affectionate narratives in the Bible. (Peter) the man who denied his friend and master plunged himself in the water – washed clean as in Baptism – to meet him (the Lord) whom he once recoiled from. The next episode will melt any heart. Peter professed his affectionate love for Jesus, who charged him to feed his lambs and sheep. Consequently, Peter received the visible leadership of the disciples of Jesus Christ and his mission. In Peter's journey from the ashes to Chief of the Apostles, we learn that our fidelity to Christ (and God) is not measured in not failing but in our response in getting back on our feet on the path of righteousness. The heartfelt response (after failing) demands openness to obeying the new commandment of Christ. His greatest commandment says, love one another as I have loved you, John 13:34. And remember this, no greater love than this, for one to lay down one's life for the friends, John 15:13. He did not give up on humanity – he came back and even shared a meal with Peter and the other brothers. What an incredible expression of love. Therefore, (for us) patient and persevering love urges us not to give up on anyone, be reconciled to all, and love affectionately.

Equally, this calls us to recognise the abundance of God's gift to humanity – for God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, anyone who believes has eternal life, John 3:16. This self-giving of Christ to us perpetuated in the Holy Eucharist is symbolised in the fish and bread he shared with his disciples; come and eat ... he took the bread and gave it to them and did the same with the fish, John 21:12-13. Among his gifts to us is the ministerial priesthood. The priest brings us the Lord Jesus Christ in the guise of bread and wine. Appreciating these gifts of love brings us to reverence Christ in the Eucharist with great devotion and adoration and teaching others to do the same. In the Eucharist, we are to see the bond of unity and charity for all Christ's faithful.

Furthermore, this path to an intimate relationship with Christ demands the willingness to grow into the new life – of grace and the Church. The profession of Peter's faith gifted us the church. We are the members of the body of Christ (the Church) – though we are many, we are one body in Christ, Romans 12:5. Knit together by the Holy Spirit; let us grow together to form a spiritual powerhouse. As members of one another, our mission is on the battlefield to smell the wounded sheep and bandage their wounds, heal the broken-hearted, feed the hungry, and reach out to those in dire need of love. The mission charges us to lead those in error to light and truth. The opposition we may encounter in our mission only reinforces the mission mandate – count yourself blessed when you meet persecutions for my sake. Most importantly, "obedience to God comes before obedience to men" Acts 5:29.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The high priest demanded an explanation of the apostles. 'We gave you a formal warning,' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. By his own right hand God has now raised him up to be leader and saviour, to give repentance and forgiveness of sins through him to Israel. We are witnesses to all this, we and the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.' They warned the apostles not to speak in the name of Jesus and released them. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name.

John 21:1-14

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
Jesus showed himself again to his disciples. It was by the Sea
of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas
called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of
Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon
Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with
you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing
that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No,' he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord,' Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land. As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.
