Dear Friends,

“What would Jesus do?” This is the question being used these days for several reasons in justifying one’s actions. Unfortunately, it is often used by people who neither know Jesus nor the Holy Scripture nor the Sacred Tradition. They turn Jesus into someone who accepts sins and even go further to portray Him as someone who encourages them to continue to do so. What would Jesus do at this? Well, He will have a laugh at their misunderstanding and ignorance.

The very truth that Jesus had to pay with His own life as a ransom for the sins shows clearly that sin can take someone’s life. It can take even the life of our God.

The lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost son – all three parables shows that God rejoices over every repentant sinner. Jesus goes painstakingly in search of the sinners and when He finds them, He doesn’t choose to remain with them nor asking them to continue to sin but rather brings them back to the fold. To be brought to the fold, one must repent and not sin again. The very first proclamation was, ‘Repent and believe in the Good News’. Repentance goes hand in hand with the determination that one will not sin again. We are living in a world that has lost the sense of sin. Even mortal sins are acceptable to the world today. This is a clear violation of the commandments. It is very unfortunate that even some religious leaders are ignorant of this violation. They use sugar coated terms such as tolerance, acceptance and inclusive!

The good shepherd wants to bring the lost sheep home
– not get lost with the sheep!

The lost coin was celebrated when it was found again
– not on the fact that it was lost!

The Father rejoiced at the return of the prodigal son
– not when he left home recklessly!

So, before asking what Jesus would do, read what He did first and know what He had to pay for our sins. Parents, please teach your children what is the meaning of sin and what are the commandments that we need to keep up in our lives. We are not perfect human beings, neither are we sinless human beings. We need to have the sense of sin and the need to repent.

Please go to confession once in three months at least. Let us not carry heavy ‘sinful luggage’ for a long time.

OUR LADY OF SORROWS, PRAY FOR US!



What Are the Seven Sorrows of Mary?

Feast day: 15 September by: Marge Fenelon

We tend to think of Mary as the Sorrowful Mother during Lent. We know from Scripture that she was there, standing at the foot of the Cross with the Apostle John. She's mentioned twice when we pray the Stations of the Cross — in the Fourth Station, when she meets her Son on the way to Golgotha and in the Thirteenth Station when Jesus' dead body is placed in her arms. Also during Lent, we sing or pray the Stabat Mater, a medieval Latin hymn describing Mary's terrible sorrow over her Son's suffering. It's hard not to think of Mary as we contemplate our Lord's Passion and Crucifixion.

In that respect, it's fitting that the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows takes place the day after the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, observed annually on Sept. 14. On that day, we celebrate the finding of the True Cross by St. Helena in the fourth century and its veneration throughout the centuries since. On the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows, we venerate the Mother of the Crucified One in appreciation of the terrible grief she endured as her Son suffered. The seven sorrows were foretold by Simeon in the Temple when he encountered the Holy Family at the Presentation of Jesus in Luke 2:25-35.

The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows dates back to the twelfth century. Since at least that time, Catholics have recognized seven events in the life of Mary that caused her great sorrow. That is why the image of Mary as Our Lady of Sorrows often shows her with seven swords piercing her Immaculate Heart.

The swords represent her grievous sorrows. Known as the Seven Dolours of Mary, these sorrows are:

1. The prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:25-35)
2. The flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15)
3. Loss of the Child Jesus for three days (Luke 2:41-50)
4. Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary (Luke 23:27-31; John 19:17)
5. Crucifixion and Death of Jesus (John 19:25-30)
6. The body of Jesus being taken from the Cross (Psalm 130; Luke 23:50-54; John 19:31-37)
7. The burial of Jesus (Isaiah 53:8; Luke 23:50-56; John 19:38-42; Mark 15:40-47)

That's a lot for one woman to endure in a lifetime! Yet, Mary wasn't just another woman; she was the woman chosen by God to bear his Son. With that great joy and responsibility also came great sorrow...and great love — for each one of us as her children. This is what our Lord asked of her as he hung dying on the Cross — to become Mother to all humankind. Love is what gave her the courage to accept Simeon's prophecy. Love is what gave her the strength to embrace each sword as it pierced her heart. Love is what urged her to accept her Son's dying request. Love is what compels her to continue caring for us tenderly, limitlessly, and faithfully.

The Virgin Mary presented her own promises to St. Bridget of Sweden for those who devote themselves to her sorrowful heart. Mary asks that the devotee prays one Hail Mary in honor of each of her sorrows.

Mary's Seven Promises:

- 1) "I will grant peace to their families."
- 2) "They will be enlightened about the divine Mysteries."
- 3) "I will console them in their pains and I will accompany them in their work."
- 4) "I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of My divine Son or the sanctification of their souls."
- 5) "I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will protect them at every instant of their lives."
- 6) "I will visibly help them at the moment of their death — they will see the face of their Mother."
- 7) "I have obtained this grace from My divine Son, that those who propagate this devotion to My tears and sorrows will be taken directly from this earthly life to eternal happiness, since all their sins will be forgiven and My Son will be their eternal consolation and joy."

In his book *The Glories of Mary*, St. Alphonsus Liguori includes meditations for Mary's seven sorrows, from pg 537.


