Dear Friends,

We must thank God for all His graces and blessings that we received as we just celebrated our parochial feast of St. Padre Pio. I had many opportunities to speak to visitors and devotees of St. Padre Pio who have received blessings from God through the intercession of St. Padre Pio. We had more than a thousand people flocking together in our parish to receive the blessings from God. When we reflect upon it, there must be something that we are doing right in our parish. Certainly, God is using us to bring more and more souls to heaven. Though our parish is neatly tucked away in the western Sydney, we have put the parish on the map literally that the people search for it and come here for God experience. Thanks be to God.

The Gospel speaks of two categories of people. The first who responded negatively to the call of God straightaway but later change their minds and did what God wants them to do. Whereas the second category of people who agreed to go but later changed their minds and did not go at all. We see these two categories in the biblical times as well as our own times. Responding to the call of God and acting upon it is a lifelong commitment.

When Jesus spoke of this parable, He indicated the behaviour of the people of Israelites vs the pagans. The chosen ones responded positively but later changed their minds whereas the so-called sinners converted their minds and turned towards God. What is our response to God on our vocation. God has a plan for all of us and He wants of us to respond willingly and do His will in our lives. We should not be complacent thinking that we have been baptised and that will suffice. It is not. We need to repent and believe in the Gospel. We need to follow Him every day of our life.

When we go up to heaven, we will be surprised seeing some people whom we thought not to be there and at the same time not seeing some people whom we thought would be in heaven. That is why it is very important that we remain faithful to Christ and His teachings. Don't expect to get to heaven just because you have a baptism certificate. Entering into heaven requires going through the narrow door.

Friends, please pray for 21 of us who are going on our pilgrimage from this Monday. We intend to visit the Holy Land and then Italy: Rome, Assisi, San Giovanni Rotando and Pietrelcina to see our beloved patron St. Padre Pio. THE ARCHANGELS



Who are the three archangels?

The three archangels whom the Church honors by name are St. Michael, St. Gabriel, and St. Raphael. They are also the only three angels who are mentioned by name in Sacred Scripture. The Feast of all three Archangels is September 29. In the traditional calendar

this was St. Michael's feast day, with St. Gabriel's being March 24th (the day prior to the Annunciation) and St. Raphael's being October 24th. Communities which celebrate the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite still celebrate the three feasts.

What is the difference between an angel and an archangel?

Unlike human beings who share a common nature, St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that as pure spirits each angel has a unique nature. Their degree of likeness to God and His Divine Spirit distinguishes them, rather than the material differences which permit us to identify individual human beings. Nonetheless, they can still be classed into groups, called choirs, according to their spiritual similarity to each other and the missions which God has given them.

Closest to God are the spirits of the highest choirs, the Seraphim, Cherubim and Thrones; closest to mankind, and most like us in spirit, are the lower choirs. Among these are the archangels and angels, who serve as greater and lesser messengers (Greek, aggelos) to human beings from God. We have the names of three of the seven arch-messengers, Michael, Raphael and Gabriel in the Sacred Scripture—St. Raphael identifies himself as one of seven who stand before the throne of God (Tobit 12:15). The names of the other four archangels are not given to us to know, and the Church forbids us to call upon by name any but the three whose names Scripture has revealed.

St. Thomas Aquinas gave us the following hierarchical list of the nine angelic choirs and using the traditional names from the Hebrew and Greek through the Latin Vulgate of St. Jerome):

Seraphim (Is. 6:2, 6, seraphin)

Cherubim (Gen. 3:24, Heb. 9:5, cherubin)

Thrones (Col. 1:16, throni)

Dominions (Col. 1:16, Eph. 1:21, dominationem)

Virtues (Eph. 1:21, virtutem)

Powers (Rom. 8:38, Eph. 1:21, potestatem)
Principalities (Col. 1:16, Eph. 1:21, principatum)
Archangels (Rev. 12:7, Jude 9, archangelus)
Angels (over 300 references, angelus)

ST. MICHAEL

Whom does Saint Michael protect?

Anyone can ask for St. Michael's protection, but he particularly defends against evil. Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903) had a vision of the evil that would come into the world in the coming century. In response, he wrote the St. Michael's Prayer and instructed it to be prayed at the end of Masses.

The prayer reads:

St. Michael the Archangel,
defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness
and snares of the Devil.
May God rebuke him, we humbly pray,
and do thou,
O Prince of the heavenly hosts,
by the power of God,
cast into hell Satan,
and all the evil spirits,
who prowl about the world
seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

"The battle against the devil, which is the principal task of Saint Michael the Archangel, is still being fought today, because the devil is still alive and active in the world." - Pope St. John Paul II...St. Michael is usually shown holding a sword while defeating the devil.

ST. GABRIEL

What is St. Gabriel the patron saint of?

He is the patron saint of telecommunication workers, radio broadcasters, postal workers, and messengers. He is often shown with lilies, symbolizing purity.

What does the Bible say about St. Gabriel?

In the Old Testament, in the Book of Daniel, St. Gabriel interprets Daniel's visions. St. Gabriel is best known for his role in the New Testament: appearing to Zechariah (Luke 1:5-25) and to Mary at the Annunciation (Luke1:26-38)

ST. RAPHAEL

What does Raphael mean in Hebrew?

St. John Paul II said, "Finally, the third archangel is called Raphael. 'Rafa-EL' means: 'God heals.' He is made known to us by the story of Tobias in the Old Testament, which is so significant for what it says about entrusting to the angels the little children of God, who are always in need of custody, care, and protection." He is the patron saint of travelers, blind people, nurses, pharmacists, physicians, and people who are ill.
