## <u>The Beautiful & Consoling Power of Our Lady of</u> <u>Sorrows, according to the Saints</u>

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows focuses on the Virgin Mary's many sufferings throughout her life, particularly during the Passion and crucifixion of her Son, Jesus Christ. It is rooted in both scripture and tradition, aiming to deepen our understanding of her role in salvation history. The Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows on Sept. 15th!

Meditating on her sufferings can help the faithful embrace the Mother of God as a model of redemptive suffering, and as a source of comfort in our spiritual lives.

"Turn your eyes incessantly to the Blessed Virgin; she, who is the Mother of Sorrows and also the Mother of Consolation, can understand you completely and help you. Looking to her, praying to her, you will obtain that your tedium will become serenity, your anguish change into hope, and your grief into love." - Saint John Paul II

"Let us bind ourselves tightly to the Sorrowful Heart of our Heavenly Mother and reflect on its boundless grief and how precious is our soul." - Saint Padre Pio

"Mary's sorrow was less when she saw her only Son crucified, than it is now at the sight of man offending Him by sin." - Saint Ignatius of Loyola

"The Martyrdom of Mary was not caused by the executioner's sword, but proceeded from bitter sorrow of heart." - Saint Bernard of Clairvaux



A reading from the letter of St James

Faith without good works is dead.

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty,' without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead.

This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds — now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

## Gospel Acclamation cf Matthew 4:23

My only glory is the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, which crucifies the world to me and me to the world. Alleluia!

Gospel Mark 8:27-35

You are the Christ ... the Son of Man was destined to suffer much.

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked, 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'
