SOLEMNITY OF OUR LADY, HELP OF CHRISTIANS, **PATRONESS OF AUSTRALIA** Feast Day: 24 May



Mary, Help of Christians, pray for us!

Every May 24th, we celebrate the feast of Mary, Help of Christians, known since the early days of our faith as "Mary, Help of Christians." Here are some facts about this Marian devotion that captivated the hearts of several saints and great Popes of the Catholic Church:

- 1. The early Christians called her "Help," which in Greek is "Boetéia" and means "She who brings help from Heaven."
- 2. The first Church Father known to have called the Virgin Mary "Help of Christians" was St. John Chrysostom in 345, in Constantinople.
- 3. She interceded in the battles of Lepanto and Vienna.
- 4. Her feast was established during the time of the French Revolution. After being imprisoned by Napoleon Bonaparte, Pope Pius VII prayed to Mary, Help of Christians to protect the Church, and so it was. In 1814, Napoleon signed his abdication, and in 1815, Pope Pius VII instituted the feast of Mary, Help of Christians on May 24th.
- 5. She appeared in dreams to St. John Bosco and asked to be honored under the title of "Help of Christians." She also requested the construction of a Church in her honor at a specific location in Turin, Italy. The Sanctuary was key to spreading this Marian devotion around the world.
- 6. Pope Saint John XXIII had a special devotion to her and kept her image hanging in his bedroom. He proclaimed her patroness of the Second Vatican Council.

- 7. In 2015, Pope Francis said he was educated in a Salesian school in his childhood, where his love for Mary Help of Christians was instilled in him.
- 8. She is the patroness of the entire Salesian Family, China, and Australia.

THE FEAST OF MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS-THE PATRONESS OF AUSTRALIA

The establishment of the feast has an interesting history, and a unique place in the Catholic history of Australia.

The feast focuses on Our Lady's help to those in need through her intercession to confront sin and to stand against anti-Christian forces. Pope Pius VII established the feast in honour of Our Lady Help of Christians in 1815.

After being imprisoned by Napoleon Bonaparte, he established the feast in thanksgiving for his release. Australia, a new colony at that time, had no Catholic priests and therefore no Mass available. The faithful recited and relied on the Rosary to sustain the Catholic community.

In 1844, Australia became the first country in the world to have Mary Help of Christians as Patroness. The tradition of this advocation goes back to 1571, when the whole of Christendom was saved by Mary Help of Christians when Catholics throughout Europe prayed the Rosary. The great battle of Lepanto occurred on October 7th, 1571.

For this reason, this date has been chosen as the feast of the Holy Rosary. In 1573 Pope Pius V instituted the feast in thanksgiving for the decisive victory of Christianity over Islamism.


Near the end of the 17th century, Emperor Leopold I of Austria took refuge in the Shrine of Mary Help of Christians at Pasau, when 200,000 Ottoman Turks besieged the capital city of Vienna, but a great victory

occurred thanks to Mary Help of Christians: on September 8, Feast of Our Lady's birthday, plans were drawn for the battle.

On September 12, Feast of the Holy Name of Mary, Vienna was finally freed through the intercession of Mary Help of Christians.

All Europe had joined with the Emperor crying out "Mary, Help!" and praying the Holy Rosary.

DON BOSCO'S PRAYER TO MARY



Most Holy Virgin Mary, Help of Christians, how sweet it is to come to your feet imploring your perpetual help.

If earthly mothers cease not to remember their children, how can you, the most loving of all mothers forget me?

Grant then to me, I implore you, your perpetual help in all my necessities, in every sorrow, and especially in all my temptations.

I ask for your unceasing help for all who are now suffering. Help the weak, cure the sick, convert sinners. Grant through your intercessions many vocations to the religious life.

Obtain for us, O Mary, Help of Christians, that having invoked you on earth we may love and eternally thank you in heaven. Amen.

St. John Bosco (also known as Don Bosco) was a dedicated priest who took on blood-thirsty revolutionaries, the Italian government and his own archbishop in his quest to rescue the homeless children of Turin. This heroic priest's undying belief in the boys he sought to help inspired them to fulfill their potential in the Catholic Faith. Don Bosco's lifelong effort to save the children of the street became the foundation of the Salesians, one of the largest child care networks in the world.



They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them.


Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said, 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans. The word of the Lord.
