WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR CONSECRATED LIFE: 02 FEBRUARY

An excerpt from the Dicastery for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life:

In this act of remaining like a seed that accepts death so that life may flourish, in diverse and complementary forms, the prophecy of all consecrated life is expressed.

Apostolic life makes visible an active closeness that supports wounded dignity; contemplative life safeguards, through intercession and fidelity, hope when faith is tested; Secular institutes bear witness to the Gospel as a discreet leaven in social and professional realities; the Ordo virginum manifests the power of gratuitousness and fidelity that opens to the future; eremitic life recalls the primacy of God and the essential that disarms the heart. In the diversity of forms, a single prophecy takes shape: to remain with love, without abandoning, without remaining silent, making one's life the Word for this time in history.

Prayer

God our Father, we consecrate ourselves to the Heart of Your Son, Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and ask You to bless all those who share in and support the mission of the Society for Religious Vocations. Strengthen the spiritual renewal and vitality of all priests and religious so that Your Church may shine more resplendently and bear witness to Your presence in our world today. In particular, inspire many men and women to respond to Your Son's call to "Come, follow Me" as members of those communities which are living the religious life according to the mind of the Church.

Father, we place these needs before You with full confidence and trust in Your goodness and love, and desire their fulfillment according to Your Holy Will.

We ask this through Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

ST JEROME EMILIANI

St. Jerome was born in Venice in 1486, of the patrician Emiliani (Miani) family. When he was ten, he tragically lost his father. He never was a scholar but a man of



action, making friends easily, cheerful, strong minded, and enthusiastic.

At twenty-five, Jerome was entrusted with

the directorship of Castelnuovo of Quero on the straits on the Piave River. The most important events of his regency occurred on August 27, 1511.

Abandoned by the soldiers who were supposed to defend the castle from the League of Cambrai, Jerome could not resist the attacking forces and was taken prisoner. He had been locked in a tower, his feet bound in chains and stone ball hung at his neck. His imprisonment lasted one month. In this condition, Jerome addressed the Blessed Virgin of the Madonna Grande's shrine. "A woman clothed in white" then appeared to him. She handed him the keys to open the chains and the door of the tower. Once he gained his freedom, he had to pass through the hostile army. Moreover, he did not know the way. He again beheld Mary and she led him to the sight of Treviso's gates.

In the following decade, he lost his mother and two of his brothers and thus became the custodian of his orphaned nephews and nieces. He was forty years old, and he had not produced a family of his own. A deep spiritual transformation started taking place in Jerome's soul. A very close friend of his, whose name remains unknown, in a biography written soon after Jerome's death, narrates: "When it pleased God to move his heart and by holy inspiration draw him from worldly occupations to himself...." Listening to God's word was the starting point. "By often listening to the word of God, he started to recall his ingratitude.

He remembered his sins against the Lord. He wept often and, at the foot of the Crucified Lord, prayed to him not to be his judge, but his Savior." Under the guidance of an expert spiritual director, a regular canon of the Convent of Charity, Jerome began to associate with friends who could help him with counsel, example, and prayer. He started to go to church, listen to homilies, and attend Masses regularly.

In a remarkably radical decision Jerome engaged himself in the imitation of the Crucified Jesus with much self-discipline and many charitable works for the poor. He was particularly touched by the Gospel passage, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." Overwhelmed by God's grace, he therefore "resolved to imitate his dear Master Jesus Christ with all his strength." In the year of his spiritual transformation, Jerome had the chance to encounter the Company of Divine Love. His work for the needy with this group excelled. On February 4, 1537, he on a bed that did not even belong to him. Four days later, during the night between February 7 and 8, he died.

"Without devotion, everything is lacking; by letting the fire of the Spirit cool down, everything will go to ruin;"

"the Company lose not its way of staying in solitude if it wants to stay with Christ;" it is only "with devotion that the good servant of the poor can confirm his brothers and people in the works of Christ."

"God does not work His things in those who have not put all their faith and hope in Him alone: and those who have great faith and hope, He filled with love and made great things in them. Therefore, if you do not lack faith and hope, He will do great things of you, exalting the humble" St. Jerome Emiliani
